

Act Like a Local

TOURIST TRAPS
Naturally, there are a shifload of tourist traps here, so remember: Don't get a Thai massage, don't buy tickets to a concert on the street, don't think there is something local about absinth, and don't go to the famous five storey disco club. Also! You will see *Trdelník* on every corner of the city. It's a pastry roll with sugar and cinnamon, that has nothing to do with Czech culture (it's a Hungarian tradition). It only became a big fuss very recently... a really funny one. Damn it.

BE PRAGUEMATIC
Instructions: enter a pub as early as 18:00, have a proper number of drinks, get home early, and be ready to work the next morning. Repeat.

DRINK LIKE A LOCAL
Drinking etiquette is an important part of our social behaviour. Some basics:
• With beer or wine, always tap glasses before your first sip in that pub; when drinking beer, tap the table after tapping glasses.
• With shots, tap your glasses every time!
• Always look directly in the person's eyes whom you're tapping with! Otherwise, you'll be cursed to have bad sex for the next 7 years.


CURRENCY
We still have our own currency, *Česká koruna* (Czech crown, Kč, CZK). For quick calculations use 1 EUR = 25,5 CZK, 1 USD = 21,5 CZK. Exchange offices have their tricks, but exceptions are Na Můstku and Kaprova 13. The safest and the cheapest way to exchange is via a cash machine (ATM).

TIPPING
Normally we leave about 20 CZK as a tip in a restaurant, usually less in a bar or a pub. Use easy maths and round the bill up to the closest 10 and leave at least 6 CZK. For instance, 175 could be rounded off to 180, 170 to 190 CZK. The tip usually represents roughly 5-10% of the bill. If you weren't satisfied with the service, there is no need to give a tip.

SUPERMARKETS
Want to prepare your own dinner or a snack for a day out? **Albert**, **Zabka**, **Billa**, **Lidl** and **Tesco** are the names of the most common supermarkets.

Last year, new security checks were introduced at the entrances. If the queue is too long and annoying, try to look for another side entrance. Tickets to certain parts are quite expensive. If you want to feel the special atmosphere of the place, come at night when the tourists leave. Open every day 6:00-22:00.

OLD AND NEW HAND IN HAND
Avoid visiting the Palladium, a trivial suburban shopping mall hidden behind a kitschy blind facade. You will never find a way out of its labyrinth. Instead, check out the **Obeční dům** (Municipal House), the Art Nouveau jewel, or **Kotva Department Store**, the pearl of brutalism.





Czech Menu

Breakfast
Buy *kolíčka*, fried pastries with jam. Or go for *luchtý*, yeast sweet pastries stuffed with cottage cheese or poppy seeds (Czech fairy-tale moms would never let you eat without a bundle full of those).

Main Dish
Lunch is the most important meal of the day. Always start your lunch with soup and then follow it up with a main meal. The best time is between 11:00-14:00. Many restaurants offer cheap daily menus. Order *vepřo-knedlo-zelo* (301), our famous combination of pork, dumplings and sauerkraut, or *svíčková* – meat with creamy vegetable sauce and dumplings (27, 39).

Vegetarian
If you don't feel like eating meat, try *zavřezný sýr* (fried cheese), or *bramboráčky* (garlic potato pancakes). Be careful! Sometimes, both are "improved" with ham or sausage.

Drink
Beer of course! *Pilsner* will hardly harm your reputation, but lately we often go for beer from the small breweries. Never heard of *Uničov*, *Svijany* or *Bernard*? That's because we keep our best treasures secret.

Still hungry?
Beer lovers should order a pub snack: *náhláňaný hermelín* (pigs' trotters), Camembert (33, 35), *slávicinka* (meat in jelly, 39), or *stopnice* (39, 40) which means "a drowned mate" but is in fact a pickled sausage. You might hate it, but it will help you become one of us. Order these in Czech and no one will suspect you to be a tourist!
