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PRAGUE TOURIST PASS

11 CROSSROADS OF GLOBAL COUNTER CULTURES
Techno afterparties, stoner psychedelic live bands and global disco, are examples of events that embody Prague's interpretation of international (counter)culture at **Cross Club**. The somewhat gloomy, but playful outdoor garden shows the designer's intentions to combine a greenhouse with steam punk and metal influences. Hungry after 22:00? Filling and nutritious meals can be ordered until unconventionally late.

A survivor of industrial architecture, **BOX** is the independent center of contemporary art, always hosting at least 3 exhibitions at the same time. A wooden airship Gulliver on the roof is dedicated to literature and is a great viewpoint.

13 FROM MEAT MARKET TO MEETING SPOT
Historically, **Hořelovská tržnice** was known as Prague's central slaughterhouse up until 1983. Nowadays, you'll find all kinds of random bazaars and restaurants, surrounded by art-nouveau and neo-renaissance buildings hosting theatre and music. The contemporary circus **Jakub78** will spark your imagination, like the street art in **Trafik Gallery**.

14 SUMMER DEAL
Holka (also named **Štvanická lávka**) is Prague's newest footbridge connecting Karlín, Štvanice Island and Hořelovská with its sleek, minimalist design. Before crossing to the Karlín side, check out **Plavba 1669**, a riverside spot hosting free open-air concerts and charity events. Feeling brave? Join the locals for a splash in the Vitava at **Baden Baden**, or relax at their beer garden while watching swans on the river.

15 UNDERGROUND FEARLESSNESS
The pedestrian **Zizkov tunnel** was built as a bomb-shelter in 1953, storing provisions and even space for corpses. It may feel neverending, but Neboj ("don't be scared") is written at the entrance for a reason. It's well maintained, with great acoustics that often attract street musicians. On the Karlín end, a different kind of eclectic sound awaits: it's **Café Garáž**, busy keeping the neighbourhood's soul alive.

From the noisy **Dlouhá** street to hidden calm, **Studio Kavalita** waits in the twilight. Take a seat in the studio's cafe, and maybe you'll meet the owner who'll share the 30-year story of this remarkable place.

19 DRAMA ON THE DANCE FLOOR
Once only a theatre, now a full-blown concert hub for rising alt bands, hyperpop parties, and DJ workshops. Do you know the style of Rodoučubsm? The adjacent building is in this style, and statues of legionnaires in the facade give it character. Enter the cafe of **ARCHAX** in the passageway to wait for your event in the mezzanine with its dark-wood-neon atmosphere.

Just behind the touristy Powder Tower, you'll find **Kampus Hyberská**, a calm student zone where academia meets art. Catch a free concert, exhibition or debate, or just chill with a coffee at **Kampus cafe**. There's always something brewing here, and there's a whole "English friendly" section in the program.

21 NEO-RENAISSANCE POST OFFICE
In our country, post offices are a source of complaints and jokes, but the **Main Post Office** stands out. It's beautiful, has extended open hours, an exhibition space on the first floor and it is the most English-friendly. In the corner, under the spiral stairs, find a window selling special Czech stamps. Send your love around Europe (stamp E) or the world (stamp Z!).

Sneak into the **Academia** bookshop (a good one!) head upstairs, and order a lemonade at the bar. Walk onto the balcony for a front-row seat to the chaos below: tourists bumping into each other amid the construction of new tram tracks on Wenceslas Square. You're welcome.

In summer, people tend to forget how cool Prague's passageways can be. But you're different. Walk in the footsteps of Einstein, Masaryk and Kafka, all once regulars here. There's even pen and paper on the tables for your poems, and perfume vending machines in the toilets for emergencies... who knows.

27 CANTÉEN CLASSIC
You came for an authentic **knedlík** (fruit-stuffed dumpling), not the take-away-fast-food concept of it. Grab a tray and fill your plate with heavy sauce at **Havelka Koruna**. One of the few remaining communist-era canteens in the city center and yes, it's still cheap. Warning! Keep the paper ticket they give you at entrance, otherwise you'll face a fine when paying at the counter.

28 USE-IT BASECAMP
Right in Old Town Square, and yet... totally invisible to the tourist crowd. That's the magic of the **Scout Institute** with its 4 floors of lively balconies and rooftop. The courtyard sometimes hosts all scene parties, while many organisations have offices in the building. Oh, and that's also where we hang our USE-IT maps on the wall of the 2nd floor!

29 ACCIDENTALLY EVIL CHURCH
At the end of WWII, Americans bombed Prague. Likely by accident - they thought it was Dresden. One bomb fell on the **Emmas Monastery** and the towers were then repaired with concrete spires that look demonic. This summer spot features a terrace with great city views, perfect for cocktails and quality dates.

30 PLAN-IT IN YOUR AGENDA
In a city where brutalist buildings keep disappearing, this is a rare win. Because it's one of the coolest places to study or mill in the city, it's a pity that the "Cubes" that host **CAME** were saved by a city-wide petition. Dive into a free interactive exhibition about Prague's future. The lovely staff will gladly explain everything in English.

31 VINYL HEAVEN
Since releasing Czech underground music is damn tough, **Rekomando** is almost an extinct species. It's a pleasure to lose track of time here, partly thanks to their sorting system (which probably makes its own inner sense). Turn right for vinyls or left for Czech books and comics. The back room conceals second-hand stuff.

32 BACK IN THE PASSAGEWAY
Did we tell you we love Prague's passageways? This one, **Václavská pasáž**, is a pure 80s flashback. It's a combination of a florist, a chocolate shop, an esoteric store, underwear shop, and the holy grail of it all: a **Cukrárna** where granaries rule the dessert scene. Order whatever they're having, this is cake wisdom in action.

33 TWO MUSEUMS IN ONE
The **National Museum** is actually two buildings: the modern one dives into Czech history, and the fancy one hits you with thousands of rocks and a whale skeleton hanging from the ceiling of one of the rooms. They're linked by an underground tunnel screening Wenceslas Square's transformations. During the 1968 Soviet Occupation, the façade was damaged: troops mistook it for the Czech public radio building.

34 TIMELESS ORIGINALITY
While haste makes waste, we invite you to slow down at **Stará Skola**, run by women with experience of life, who answer their entrepreneurial calling, may it be in their own way. This cafe is part of an organisation that tackles loneliness among the elderly in the city. Recipes behind the pastries, pancakes and pies cannot be more original than this.

35 EAT AROUND THE CLOCK
"Sleep is for the weak" is a logical conclusion when following **Jelena Marjánka's** work ethics. Don't let the blue-sky ceiling fool you: you're not dreaming. That really is a Czech meal you can eat at 3:45 a.m. in a 24/7 typical canteen where night workers stop by. It's cheap, for real, and if you want to blend in, try ordering in Czech.

36 PUNK PORTIONS
In the middle of the construction of soon-to-be corporate **Smichov district**, **Esteria** stands its punk ground. The vegan canteen is a must for tasty, massive, and affordable Czech meals with metal blasting in the back. Check out the underground punk/metal gigs next door at **Sukrva (Esteria)**. They even have a vegan ice cream stand in front of the building in summer!

37 WALL'S NIGHT WATCH
Maybe catch inside during winter, the magic happens here with the big terrace with a view on the fortress walls. **Na Hradčích** hosts gigs, happy locals, and serves the crunchiest, tastiest fries around. 41 NO REGRETS

Beer is more than an alcoholic drink, it's a cultural heritage here. And we love it too; Czechs drink the most beer in the world (130 liters per person per year).
1/3 of the bars closed because of Covid and they are also threatened by inflation and the high rise of rent prices. Help them out and avoid buying beer in the supermarket: you can literally grab one anywhere, from a local pub on the corner to **summer beer gardens**.
Try our craft beers! You might be surprised by **degrees** (°) on beers. It's not the amount of alcohol. Typically, 10° = 4%, check the labels or ask.

61 LUNCH TIPS
We usually have lunch at 11:00-14:00 when many restaurants offer cheaper daily menus (on weekdays).
If you're vegan or vegetarian, apart from the ones listed below, we also recommend **Dhaba Beas** and **Loving Hut**, the ubiquitous and cheap self-service bistros.
